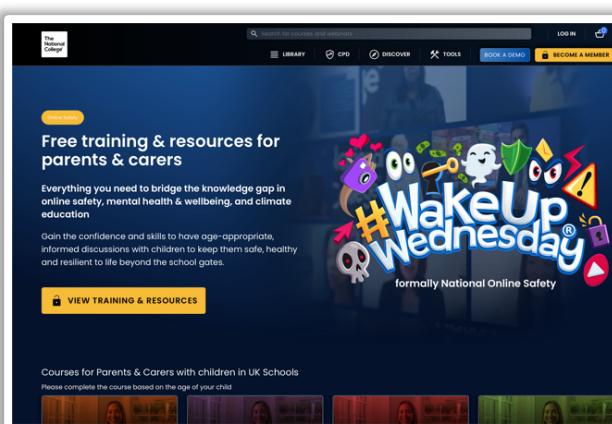
Are theme for this half term will be Thankfulness.
